Dear Friends,

Forty percent is the statistic that best captures the work of the Redwood Empire Food Bank in the 2008–2009 fiscal year. This figure represents the alarming increase in the number of people turning to us for help during the past two years. Of course, the percentage alone diminishes the profound story of each person who wondered from where their next meal would come, or felt the gnawing discomfort of hunger.

Now touching the lives of 70,000 people every month, the REFB has become a critical source of support — a vital safety net — for one in six people in Sonoma County. Along with this increase has been a change in the makeup of those who need our help. The year laid claim to many people who had never before sought food assistance. Care packages of food were given to young couples who just weeks before were gainfully employed. Senior citizens, who were already living on fixed incomes, were helpless as their retirement funds evaporated before their eyes. And more children than ever before lined up at our *Summer Lunch Program* sites, as their families did their best to provide adequate nutrition through the summer without the help of school meals.

The reality that food is as basic a necessity as air and water was never more evident. Serving as the '911' for people in need of food, it was a year when distraught people called our help line with a unique combination of panic and shame as they struggled to feed their families. The most unsettling call came from a woman who through her tears shared, "the only thing I had to feed my daughter last night was marshmallows."

As bleak as the year was economically, the Redwood Empire Food Bank continued to innovate and expand its service to the most vulnerable people with whom we share our community. Most notably, we created school-based produce pantries that opened in the fall of 2009 at two of the most economically challenged elementary schools. These pantries provide nutritious food to parents when they pickup their children at the end of the school day.

We made serious strides in developing our own food line called *Simply Supper*. With four goals in mind, this project will create food that is healthy, delicious, easy to prepare, and affordable. Driven by shifting market forces and diminishing availability of healthy donated food, we plan to distribute this food not only to people in need in Sonoma County, but also to improve the provision of food for food banks across the country. It is in this effort that the work of the REFB as a leader in hunger relief can be recognized.

The silver lining to the myriad of challenges our community faced during 2009 is the generous and steadfast support of our donors. As the case has been since we began our work in 1987, all that we accomplished during the year came as the result of the generous outpouring of our community. Throughout the year, both individuals and corporations stretched their annual support to ensure that the REFB was able to expand services — offering a much-appreciated helping hand to people who were already hurting, and to people who never imagined they would be in need.

ENDING HUNGER IN OUR COMMUNITY

Serving Sonoma County for over two decades, the Redwood Empire Food Bank (REFB) has developed three major hunger initiatives to provide low-income families, seniors and children their most basic necessity — nutritious food.

Every Child, Every Day

The REFB ensures that at-risk children have the opportunity to succeed through programs that address the special developmental needs of preschoolers and programs that fill the gaps in school-based nutrition assistance.

Recognizing that children only have one chance to get a healthy start in life, REFB developmental programs provide nutritious food to children from low-income families during their critical early childhood years. *The Megan Furth Harvest Pantry* specifically addresses the increased risk of anemia among these children. This mobile pantry travels weekly to high-need neighborhoods providing fruits and vegetables along with lessons designed to educate parents on how to prevent childhood anemia and the benefits of proper nutrition.

Our newest effort in support of families with small children is the WIC (Women, Infants and Children) store through which participating families can redeem their government issued food vouchers, while learning about other available services for their children and the entire family.

Once children enter school, the REFB offers programs to fill the gaps in nutrition services by providing healthy snacks in after-school settings, nutritious groceries to take home over the weekend and meals during the summer recess.

Senior Security

For years they took care of others, but too many seniors in our community are now living on low fixed incomes and unable to take care of all their own basic needs. The REFB's monthly grocery boxes, weekly produce pantries and special programs like the *Diabetes Wellness Project* provide the nutritional stability seniors need to lead healthy and independent lives.

Neighborhood Hunger Network

The REFB works to end hunger for all by providing food assistance from Petaluma to Cloverdale, Sonoma to Occidental, and everywhere in between.

We operate our own county-wide pantry system and emergency food distributions, providing staple groceries and fresh produce to anyone in need of help. We are also a major source of food for a network of other hunger-relief organizations that include pantries, dining rooms, kitchens and shelters.

Enhancing Community Resources

The REFB collects food from local, regional and national sources. This year we brought

into Sonoma County over \$16 million worth of food to supply our programs and those of partnering organizations. This represents 11.7 million pounds of food that moved from the shelves of the REFB to the tables of 70,000 of our neighbors who are struggling to get enough to eat. The REFB is always looking for new and innovative ways to provide nutrition assistance and to help people help themselves. We created *From The Ground Up*, a pilot project to encourage low-income families and seniors to grow their own produce. With the help of a generous group of volunteers, 2,000 robust tomato plants were distributed to 480 participants.

In 2009, the REFB took part in a special project that will result in a better understanding of the realities of hunger in Sonoma County. We participated in a nationwide hunger survey through which volunteers and REFB staff interviewed 357 recipients at food distributions around the county. Those surveyed generously took the time to share their stories and circumstances. The study results, which will be released in early 2010, will help us to better serve our Sonoma County neighbors who are in need now and those who will need our help in the future.

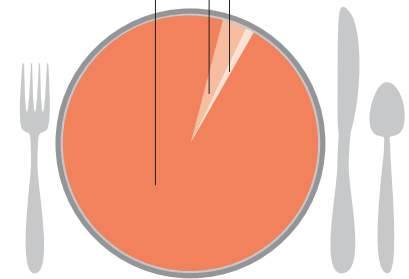

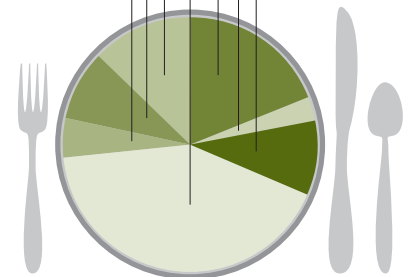
